Job Summary

The Manometry Registered Nurse (RN) is a self-directed clinician responsible for independently operating a gastrointestinal diagnostic procedures program in a physician office setting. This role functions with minimal supervision, requires strong clinical judgment, procedural expertise, autonomous decision-making, and maintaining effective collaboration with physicians and the Clinical Director. The RN serves as the primary procedural clinician for esophageal and anorectal manometry.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

Include the following:

- Independently perform esophageal and anorectal manometry procedures.
- Serve as the sole procedural clinician, managing all phases without routine direct supervision.
- Conduct pre-procedure patient assessment, education, and preparation, including dietary and medication instructions.
- Set up, calibrate, operate, and troubleshooting high-resolution manometry equipment.
- Skillfully pass and manage catheters while prioritizing patient comfort and safety.
- Acquire, review, and document manometric data for physician interpretation.
- Maintain equipment cleaning, disinfection, and preventive maintenance in compliance with infection control standards.
- Coordinate scheduling and patient flow with minimal direction.
- Troubleshoot equipment issues and coordinate with vendor technical support as needed.
- Serve as primary owner of the procedural program, ensuring operational readiness.
- Maintain procedure room setup, inventory, and equipment functionality.
- Identify and communicate equipment, supply, or workflow needs to the Clinical Director.
- Stay current on procedural techniques, equipment updates, and best practices.
- Act as a resource for procedural questions from staff and providers.
- Perform and document comprehensive patient assessments.
- Obtain and verify informed consent.
- Maintain accurate, timely EMR documentation.
- Administer medications per RN scope of practice.
- Recognize, manage, and escalate adverse reactions or complications as appropriate.
- Adhere to OSHA, HIPAA, and infection control standards.
- Participate in quality improvement initiatives and staff meetings.
- Perform other duties as assigned.
