Job Summary

CRNAs play a crucial role in providing safe and effective anesthesia care to patients undergoing various surgical procedures in our ambulatory surgery center. This position offers the opportunity to work in a physician owned medical practice dedicated to delivering high-quality patient care.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

- Perform pre-anesthetic assessments and evaluations of patients to determine their anesthesia needs and develop individualized anesthesia care plans.
- Administer anesthesia according to established protocols and standards of care.

- Monitor patients' vital signs and physiological responses throughout the perioperative period, adjusting anesthesia as necessary to ensure patient safety and comfort.
- Manage anesthesia-related emergencies and complications promptly and effectively, collaborating with other healthcare providers as needed.
- Provide post-anesthesia care as appropriate.
- Document anesthesia care, patient assessment findings, and perioperative events accurately and comprehensively in the medical record.
- Collaborate with providers, nurses, and other members of the healthcare team to optimize patient outcomes and ensure smooth perioperative care processes.
- Participate in quality improvement initiatives and adhere to regulatory requirements and accreditation standards related to anesthesia services.
